





CRIMES OF CONVICTION OF SUPERVISEES




CRIMINAL HISTORY CATEGORY OF SUPERVISEES




**U.S. PROBATION DEPARTMENT PCRA (“RISK”) CATEGORIES
ASSIGNED TO 123 STUDY POPULATION SUPERVISEES**




LENGTH OF SENTENCES OF SUPERVISEES




RACE/ETHNICITY OF SUPERVISEES



AGE OF SUPERVISEES AT START OF SUPERVISION




LEVEL OF EDUCATION AT START OF SUPERVISION





STUDY POPULATION (152) VS. ALL FEDERAL SUPERVISEES




SENTENCES WHICH INCLUDED THERAPEUTIC COUNSELING AND/OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT



LENGTH OF TERM OF SUPERVISED RELEASE IMPOSED AT ORIGINAL SENTENCE




NUMBER OF YEARS OF SUPERVISION REDUCED BECAUSE OF EARLY TERMINATION




STUDY POPULATION VS. ALL FEDERAL SUPERVISEES



FELONY REARREST OUTCOMES STUDY POPULATION




RETURN TO PRISON STUDY POPULATION VS. ALL FEDERAL SUPERVISEES




PROBATION VIOLATION COMPARISON AS OF APRIL 6, 2021

STUDY POPULATION VS. ALL FEDERAL SUPERVISEES




CURRENT STATUS OF 152 SUPERVISEE STUDY POPULATION




CHC OF EARLY TERMINATION SUPERVISEES*




CHC OF NORMAL COURSE TERMINATION SUPERVISEES

*CHC (or Criminal History Category) is included in the supervisee’s Presentence Investigation Report and is integral to determining the advisory sentence. See United States Sentencing Guidelines 7B1.4.

**PCRA (or Post Conviction Risk Assessment) is calculated by the Probation Department to reflect a supervisee’s risk level and considers personal characteristics and circumstances statistically associated with recidivism such as criminal history and substance abuse.
